Karin Melchert "Sometimes" Jazz, pop and more – made in Luxembourg

Sometimes she enjoys to sing jazz, sometimes she is more into rock and pop, sometimes she prefers musicals and chansons, and sometimes she likes to experiment and try new things, and this is exactly what Karin Melchert did when she recorded her new Album "Sometimes".

When planning to record a new CD the question came up which music styles to chose. Since Karin liked all of the above she chose to include a little bit of everything and called the result her own style: a combination of Jazz, Swing, Pop, and a touch of classical music. With this concept it is not surprising that names of composers such as Cole Porter and Sergei Rachmaninoff can be found right next to those of rock- and film stars like Status Quo and Marlene Dietrich. The CD also contains a couple of her own compositions.

"Sometimes" is the 2nd CD Karin has recorded since she moved to Luxembourg in 1995. Since the release of her first CD "Musical and Movie World Hits" in 1998 she has performed on numerous occasions in 7 European Countries, Africa and Asia.

Two noteworthy features of the CD are that it is a product completely "made in Luxembourg" and that it has been recorded exclusively with acoustic instruments. The production performed by *Little Swiss Digital Productions* with support from *Linster Studios* involves a great number of renowned Luxembourgish musicians, string orchester Estro Armonico, plus the double bass player Sal La Rocca (B) and guitarist Marty Townsend (US).
